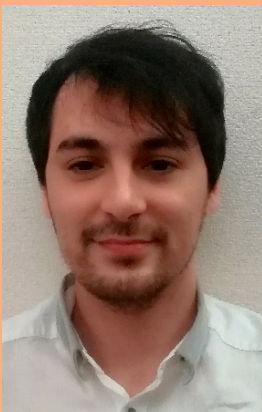

Abstract

The principle of due diligence sees application in various field of international law. But in environmental law, one can easily says that it holds particular importance This presentation aims at analyzing the roots of due diligence in general international law, owing to the work of the ILC, and identify its content in the particular field of environmental law through judicial decisions in order to pull back the veil on this controversial issue.



Tony Cabus is a PhD student in international law at GSICS, Kobe University. After obtaining a master degree in international law and European law at Aix-Marseille University of Aix-en-Provence and Pierre Mendes France University of Grenoble, he joined the doctoral program of Kobe University with the MEXT scholarship program.
